### Hnappavellir:

Our most popular and biggest climbing area is Hnappavellir, where the NYC will take place. The land is owned by few farmers in the area and because of their goodwill, it has been possible for climbers to camp there and set routes. Therefore, we ask everyone to please treat the area with respect and not leave any trash behind. As has been pointed out on [www.klifurhusid.is/NYC](http://www.klifurhusid.is/NYC), there are no showers or toilets with running water (only "none flushing toilets") at Hnappavellir.

### **Climbing equipment:**

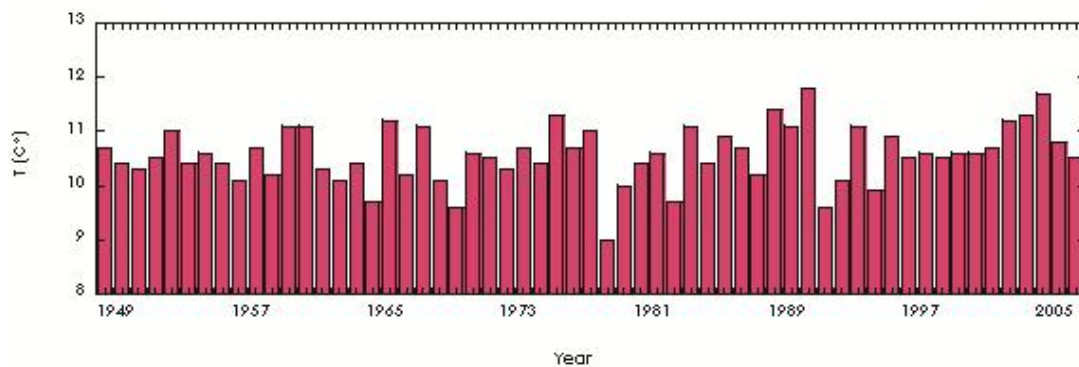
- All teams must bring their own climbing equipment. 1 rope + 10 quickdraws/2 climbers.
- Everyone: Helmet, harness, shoes, chalk, daisy chain + carabiner, ATC + carabiner.

### **Clothes:**

- Warm clothes (wool top and trousers), warm jacket, thick socks, hats and gloves, rain clothes.
- Boots and/or good shoes, (sandals, if the weather is nice ☺).
- Swimming clothes, towel.

**Camping / eating:**

- Sleeping bag, mattress. Iceland will provide big tents to sleep in (7-15 people in each one).
- Plate, mug/glass and cutlery (fork, knife, spoon). Maybe a cloth to dry the dishes.
- Soap, etc.
- When sleeping in Hafnarfjörður, at Björk Sport facility, participants will be sleeping on their mattresses in a big hall.
